Tania León is a highly regarded composer and conductor recognized for her accomplishments as an educator and advisor to arts organizations. Recent commissions include "The Little Rock Nine", an opera with libretto by Thulani Davis and historical research by Henry Louis Gates, Jr. "Ser" for the Los Angeles Philharmonic and "Green Pastures" for The Metropolitan Museum. She holds Doctorate Degrees from Colgate University, Oberlin and SUNY Purchase Colleges.

A founding member of the Dance Theatre of Harlem, she instituted the Brooklyn Philharmonic Community Concert Series, was co-founder of the American Composers Orchestra "Sonidos de las Americas Festivals", New Music Advisor to the New York Philharmonic and Founder, Artistic Director of the Composers Now organization and annual Festival. Composers Now is an organization in New York City founded in 2010, and dedicated to empowering all living composers, while celebrating the diversity of their voices and honoring the significance of their contributions to the cultural fabric of society. A Professor at Brooklyn College since 1985, she was named Distinguished Professor of the City University of New York in 2006. In 2010 she was inducted into the American Academy of Arts and Letters, in 2013 she was the recipient of the prestigious 2013 ASCAP Victor Herbert Award. Most recently she was awarded a 2018 United States Artists Fellowship and is a newly elected member of the American Academy of Arts and Science.



INNER FRAGMENTS

Inner Fragments, An Exhibition of Contemporary Iranian Women Artists- Opening Reception (with live entertainment) February 19, 4:00 pm

Part of the Winter 2019 Iran Symposium, this exhibition is non-political, only showcasing art produced by Iranian women artists which reflects many of the same interests and concerns of artists in the West.

This exhibition will not play the exotic card to win the sympathy of a Western audience, but will focus on universal themes that women experience in their lives, beyond being mothers, wives, and daughters. This exhibition focuses on women's inspirations, intimate moments, frustrations and confusion, vulnerability, and sense of alienation they go through while engaged in each of these roles.

Produced by the 7500 miles project, an ongoing online project that offers a new approach in representing a new wave in Iranian contemporary art and specifically women artists.

7500 Miles portrays a slice of women's lives that is profound and beyond typical clichés. It is an invitation to forget the stereotypical images of Iran and women and it invites the viewer to be a part of their intimate and private moments through their lens.

Inner Fragments

The 1979 Islamic Revolution, which overthrew 2500 years of the Persian monarchy, transformed the dynamics of Iran's art scene. A young generation of artists born during the aftermath of the Iran-Iraq war and revolution endured a series of intense political circumstances, sanctions and isolationism on the international scene where part of their world order. Their art took a distinct turn through the medium of wide-ranging styles and genres, often with a subtlety, a deeper insight, and more intimate expression.

"Inner Fragments", co-curated by Mahsa Soroudi and Parisa Ghaderi, is an exhibition of sixteen Iranian female artists, most of whom live and work inside Iran. It portrays a slice of Iranian women's lives that is profound and beyond typical clichés such as Hijab and oppression. Additionally, considering the geopolitics of Iran and the U.S., with the current administration, the exhibition aims for a greater intention, using art to transcend geographical and political boundaries. The curators are hoping to close the gap between Iran and the U.S., and highlight the new wave of contemporary Iranian art as an alternative mode of understanding modern Iran.






FLINT: IT'S NOT JUST ABOUT THE WATER

MIGRARE

"Migrare" is a dance and videography research project conducted by School of Music, Theater and Dance MFA student Mario Vircha in France, Jordan, Greece and Costa Rica; four countries that have welcomed refugee dance artists whose work he wished to investigate. He studied how the process of cultural extension from native countries to host countries is being nourished by the artistic communities in these new locations. He explored the ways refugee and displaced artists are creating work in response to the political situations in the countries they have fled and the challenges of the new environment. Mario's research leads directly to his MFA thesis project, which is based on themes of migration, and which will combine live dance performance with recorded video projection. His time abroad is contributing to the production of a short film and live dance choreography to be titled "Migrare". It will chronicle the personal and creative journeys of these immigrant dance artists.

One of the aims of this project is to show how immigrant artists are making a significant contribution to the expansion of global culture. In some ways migration is blurring the borders of the art activity. "Migrare" can also be used as a platform for those artists that do not have an opportunity to expose or elevate their voice to the international community, such is the case with a large group of Middle Easterners that found refuge in Jordan and are now looking for space or collaborators.




HIDDEN TO OBSERVATION (H2O)

Students in SI 616 (Advanced Topics in Graphic Design and Visual Communications) developed alternative interpretations, from Ripple Effect, using similar water contamination data from Flint. Seven of their posters will be on view in the Duderstadt Center connector hall alcoves in advance of the Nov. 25th opening of their exhibition Hidden to Observation (H2O) in the gallery.

RIPPLE EFFECT

Ripple Effect is an interactive art exhibition that visualizes local water quality data through sound, light, and water. Through software technology, water contamination data is translated into sound waves.

The installation consists of speakers that play the 'data sound tracks', which vibrate the water held in attached trays. The sonic vibrations create unique patterns to emerge in the water, known as water cymatics. Participants hear and see the water vibrate based on the chemical concentrations in their water samples.

Ripple Effect travels to communities that neighbor resource extraction activity and aims to transform the way people understand their data in relation to their environment.




