DID YOU KNOW?

An estimated 212,920 new cases of invasive breast cancer are expected to occur among women in the United States during 2006. An estimated 40,970 women will die from breast cancer. It is estimated that 1,720 men will be diagnosed and 460 men will die of breast cancer during 2006. In addition to invasive breast cancer, 61,980 new cases of in situ breast cancer are expected to occur among women in 2006.

A woman who exercises four hours per week reduces her risk of breast cancer. Eating a low-fat, nutritious diet also reduces the risk of breast cancer.

Early detection is crucial. The 5-year survival rate for breast cancer that has not spread to lymph nodes or outside of the breast is 98%
